Quantum Electronics Prize Regulations

PREAMBLE

- a) The European Physical Society through its Quantum Electronics and Optics Division will award a Quantum Electronics Prize.
- b) The prize will be called "*Quantum Electronics Prize of the European Physical Society*".
- c) The prize will initially be awarded every two years, at the occasion of the European Quantum Electronics Conference which is organized by the EPS. The QEO Board may later decide on another time interval.

REGULATIONS

- 1) The prize will be awarded to one or more persons who made outstanding contributions to Quantum Electronics in the experimental or theoretical area. The award may be given for pure and applied research.
- 2) The prize will be awarded without restrictions on nationality, ethnicity or religion.
- 3) The prize will consist of a medal and a diploma.
- 4) Only works which appeared as peer-reviewed publications can be considered in the proposals for candidates to the prize.
- 5) Persons who have deceased since the work was performed cannot be nominated for the prize.
- 6) Self-nominations are permitted. All nominations need to be accompanied by at least two endorsement letters by experts in the field who are professionally independent of the nominee.
- 7) The selection committee consists of 7 persons: 5 physicists, chosen by the QEO Board, the Chairman and the secretary of the QEO Board of the European Physical Society. The term of membership in the Committee should not exceed 4 years. The Committee will elect its own chairman.
The committee considers each of the eligible nominations for the award and makes final recommendations to the QEO Board.
- 8) The final recommendation of the QEO Board is submitted for ratification to the EPS Executive Committee, with a short description of the motives.
